

Communication and Language

Listening, Attention & Understanding:

- Listens for longer periods of time
- Follows two-step instructions, becoming less reliant on visuals or gesture to understand

Speaking:

- Uses new vocabulary independently after being taught, thinking about the meaning of words
- Asks lots of questions eg what, where and why
- Asks relevant questions or makes relevant comments in relation to what they have just heard

Understanding the World

People and Communities:

- Considers the ways they have changed since they were born

The Natural World:

- Develops an understanding of growth, decay and changes over time
- Begins to understand the need to respect and care for all living things

Around the World:

- Know some similarities and differences between different religious and cultural communities

Religious Education

- Children will learn about The Creation story.
- Children will talk about how each one of us is unique.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

Building Relationships:

- Develops friendships with particular children

Self-Regulation:

- Becomes more flexible and cooperative when responding to others' needs and can demonstrate greater self-control independently sometimes while seeking emotional support or practical help from an adult in difficult situations other times

Managing Self:

- Manages turn-taking more independently and introduces 'rules' into games

Maths

Number:

- Learn number bonds up to 5 and some to 10

Numerical Patterns:

- Count to 30
- Compare quantities using 'greater than', 'less than' and 'same'.

Shape, Space and Measure:

- Describe features of 2D shapes

Physical Development

Gross Motor Skills:

- Explores, replicates and improvises different movements, gestures and ways of travelling including turning while attempting to move in time with the music

Fine Motor Skills:

- Forms upper-case and lower-case letters as well as numerals 0-9 correctly
- Uses tools with greater precision eg cuts on the line, paints inside a shape

Literacy

Word Reading:

- Reads simple sentences containing known common exception words
- Reads words consistent with the phonics knowledge by sounding and blending

Comprehension:

- Demonstrate understanding of what has been read to them by retelling stories using their own words

Writing:

- Write simple phrases and sentences that can be read by others
- Spell words by identifying the sounds in them and representing those sounds with letters
